• The older son limits life to work

• Music and dancing don't "result" in anything

THE SON'S INQUIRY

• The son doesn't call the father, but a servant

Luke 15:26 And he called one of the servants, and asked what these things meant.

THE SON'S WORLD FALLS APART

• The bad news

 The younger brother stands for everything that older brother hates

THE SON'S WORLD FALLS APART

• The bad news

• The fatted calf was the older son's proof of his work

Luke 15:27 And he said unto him, your brother has come; and your father has killed the fatted calf, because he has received him safe and sound.

THE SON'S ANGER

• The son disagrees with the father and refuses to be in his presence

Luke 15:28 And he was angry, and would not go in

THE FATHER'S RESPONSE

• The father doesn't reject this son either

- All the time the younger son was in the far country, the father was waiting for him
- All this time the older son is slaving, the father has been wanting to restore him too

therefore his father came out, and entreated him.

• The son's false belief system

- Service
- Obedience

Luke 15:29-30 And he answering said to his father, Lo, these many years have I served you, neither transgressed I at any time your commandment:

• The father doesn't give him anything

o Reality

- The son had full ownership and full authority over the state
- The father wasn't withholding, the son's problem was his own heart and false belief system
