Mark 14:61-62 ... Again the high priest asked him (Jesus), and said unto him, Are you the Christ, the Son of the Blessed? And Jesus said, I am: and you shall see the Son of man sitting on the right hand of power, and coming in the clouds of heaven.

• What is my opinion about Jesus? Do I think He is God?

If I don't believe He is God:

- How I do explain the tremendous historic impact He had? And how do I explain that millions of people all over the world claim that He has changed their lives today?
- Did I spend enough time to really investigate the claims of Jesus? Is my
 opinion about Jesus really based on my own research on this topic? Or am I
 simply giving an emotional argument? Or am I simply believing about Jesus
 what someone else told me to believe about Jesus?
- Do I want to investigate more on this topic? How will I do that?

- Is the way I live my life really reflecting what I say I believe?
- In what area of my life do my actions show that I don't really believe and trust God fully? Do I want to ask God to increase my Faith and to change the way I live?
