Who is God?

Below are some questions that could help us all reflect on today's sermon and to go deeper with God during our quiet time this week.



Deuteronomy 32:4 He is the Rock, his work is perfect: for all his ways are justice: a God of truth and without iniquity, just and right is he.

- Do I see God the Father and Jesus as one? Or do I see them separate from each other?
- Do I struggle with the statement that the God of the Old Testament and the God of the New Testament is exactly the same? Why?
- Which attribute of God from today's sermon do I have difficulty embracing/believing? Why? (God is Holy, Just, Love, Merciful)
- Is my definition of God's love in line with the Bible's definition of love? How does it differ? Why? (compare to 1. Cor. 13:4-8)
- Do I struggle to believe that God is Holy? That nothing He thinks or does is not perfect? Why?
- When it comes to God's justice and God's mercy: Do I believe more in one than in the other?
- Which of these attributes of God do I want to focus on these coming weeks and learn more about?
