


# **DATING**

# SOME BIBLICAL PRINCIPLES

- There's not a "10 steps guide"
- But there are biblical principles



#### Surrender

Starting a relationship without "seeking God first" is sin

John 5:19 Then answered Jesus and said unto them, Verily, Verily, I say unto you, The Son can do nothing of himself, but what he sees the Father do: for whatsoever things he does, these also does the Son likewise.

Proverbs 3:5-6 Trust in the LORD with all your heart; and lean not unto your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct your paths.

- O Do not ask: "What can I get out of this relationship?"
- o Instead, ask: "What is best for the <u>other</u> person, especially if the relationship does not work out?"

- Heartbreak happens, when we have to take something back that we have given to another person for a time
- Get to know each other, but leave the romantic elements out

I will not start a relationship until I know it's going to last (Ryoko)

- We need to avoid giving something to a person that we are not sure we can give for a lifetime
- Ask: If the relationship doesn't work out: Would I have to "take something back"?

 Whatever we do, I don't want <u>you</u> to get hurt if the relationship doesn't work out

### Get advice from people who have gone ahead of you

Choose people you look up to


Proverbs 11:14 Where no counsel is, the people fall: but in the multitude of counselors there is safety.

Proverbs 12:15 The way of a fool is right in his own eyes: but he that hearkens unto counsel is wise.

Proverbs 15:22 Without counsel plans go wrong: but in the multitude of counselors they are established.

Proverbs 19:20 Hear counsel, and receive instruction, that you may be wise in your latter days.

Do a marriage-prep program together




## Get her father's approval

• When a woman marries, she changes her headship

Proof to her father that you are willing to love her sacrificially

Genesis 29:18 And Jacob loved Rachel; and said, I will serve you seven years for Rachel your younger daughter.

Men initiate, women respond



## FOR MEN

• Am I willing to lay down my life for this woman?

Ephesians 5:25 Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ also loved the church, and gave himself for it;

## FOR WOMEN


O Do I trust this man enough to completely submit to him?

Ephesians 5:22 Wives, submit yourselves unto your own husbands, as unto the Lord.

Share about your life visions and see if there is a potential match

- Get to know your potential spouse's parents
  - There's a good chance that the other person will treat his/her husband/wife the way he/she treats his/her parents today

- Get to know your potential spouse's friends
  - Try to get to know each other in groups



# **HOW TO MAKE A DECISION**

#### Put it all together

- What does God say?
- How can we bring Glory to God in a way that we cannot as two individuals?
- Does this relationship help us get closer to God?
- What do other married couples/mentors/friends say about us?
- Do our life plans and vision match?
- Are we willing to love sacrificially/submit unconditionally?
- Do I have peace about this marriage?
- Do I have any major concerns about marrying this person?

# HOW TO MAKE A DECISION

#### Put it all together

- Do my emotions allow me to still make a rational decision?
- What is the purpose of this relationship?
- What is that thing that can never change that will help us get through tough times?
- What do our parents say? What does our church say?
- How does the other person treat his/her parents?
- What do the other person's friends tell me about him/her?

# MY PERSONAL CONVICTION

#### There's no need for dating

- We can get to know each other without being romantic
- The Bible only mentions friendship, betrothal and marriage (no dating)

### We can consider marriage without dating

- If things don't work out, nobody gets hurt
- If things do work out, we can enjoy the blessings of "having waited for the right time"

# MY PERSONAL CONVICTION

- Prepare yourself as much as possible before we enter the "romantic stage"
- Get married quickly once we know we will get married
