

Repentance: Psalm 51

Psalms 51:16-17 For you desire not sacrifice; else would I give it: you delight not in burnt offering. The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit: a broken and a contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.

Below are some questions that can help us all go deeper with God during our quiet time this week

- Is my repentance based on my personal and intimate knowledge of God and His character?
- Is my repentance focused on my relationship with God? Or is it focused on the problems my sin created in this world?
- Am I bold like David in my repentance? Or am I held back by fear and selfcondemnation?
- Is my focus mainly about me? Or is it about God's Glory?
- In the sermon, three things were mentioned that David didn't talk about (Focus on worldly consequences, focusing too much on a specific sin, making promises to God). Which of these elements do I sometimes try to include in my repentance?
